RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Heifers must be recorded solely in the junior's name.
2. May enter only one Pair of Heifers in a class.
3. Exhibitor must furnish official Health Certificate required by state. Health papers must be checked. All Heifers not accompanied to the show by registration papers, must show AOB classes.
4. 4-H members showing in the Junior Show must pay entry and stall fees.
5. Exhibitors must furnish their own tie-out material. All livestock tie-outs, trucks, trailers, etc., must park in the designated livestock area or you will forfeit your premiums. All Cattle tie outs in North Lot.
6. **Heifers and steers must be checked in and weighed by 10:00 a.m. Friday, June 28, 2019.**
7. Breed classes are Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn (1/2 Blood & Higher), Simmental (1/2 Blood and Higher), and Crossbred AOB. Registration papers and health papers must be turned in to the superintendents on all purebred females.
8. Steer classes are Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn (1/2 Blood & Higher), Simmental (1/2 Blood and Higher) and Crossbred AOB.
9. Release time – All pens must be cleaned out & release card signed by Superintendent before premium will be issued. The superintendent will let no one leave until all checks are picked up. If the check is not picked up, the exhibitor will forfeit their premium check to the Fair Association. If you would like your **check mailed** to you, please bring a **self-addressed, stamped envelope to the Secretary's Office** (or purchase in the fair office) by 8 p.m. Sunday, the last day of fair.
10. All Classes are subject to change at Superintendent's Discretion.
11.
 1. Any boy or girl, who during the year has conducted a supervised 4-H or FFA program, with records kept therein, may enter the Junior Livestock Division. A minimum age of 8 as SEPTEMBER 1, 2018 is required to participate in the State Fair Junior Livestock Division.
 2. Programs may be done under the supervision of:
 - A. 4-H leaders or Extension staff members
 - B. Teachers of Vocational Agriculture
 3. Illinois 4-H members exhibiting in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair must be active 4-H club members, as verified by the County Extension Office and at least 8 but not yet 18 years of age on September 1, 2018. Active Illinois FFA members, as verified by local Teachers of Vocational Agriculture, may participate.
 4. Individuals previously enrolled in Illinois 4-H or FFA programs and under 21 years of age as of September 1, 2018, may participate in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair provided they are active FFA members as verified by Illinois FFA and in accordance with one of the following options:
 - A. Maintain active membership on the roster of their local high school FFA Chapter;
 - B. Maintain active membership in a collegiate FFA Chapter in a post-secondary institution of higher education in the State of Illinois; or
 - C. Maintain active membership in an Illinois FFA Alumni Chapter. FFA members must not have reached their 21st birthday as of September 1, 2018.
12. **If Breed numbers fall below five animals then breed will be combined with others.**
13. Ownership of Steers should be February 1st and Heifers May 1st of the current year.
14. We will follow the fitting and ethics rules set by the Illinois State Fair Junior Show.
15. Animal must be the property of the exhibitor, unless exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class.
16. For Safety Reasons: **No Butt Fans will be allowed, All fans must be hung from above. There is a limit of 1 fan per 3 animals.**
17. No equipment in walkways (wheelbarrows, lawn chair, fans, etc.)
18. No trimming chutes will be allowed in cattle barns after the last show day.
